



The examination guidelines have been thoroughly compared to the CAPS document. The following are highlighted:

Grade 10

Top of P. 20: The wording of the chemical bonds definition is slightly different.

Grade 11

Bottom of P. 15: Density is left out. Boiling point, etc. are defined.

P. 18 and 19: Specific examples are named. Everything is covered through the course of the unit in Doc Scientia's Textbook and Workbook.

Bottom of P. 19: Balancing is also done using the redox tables. Tables must be provided to learners in Grade 11. How to use these tables will also have to be explained to learners. For that, Doc Scientia has compiled the addendum for Grade 11.

P. 20: According to the CAPS document, learners have a choice between gold, iron and phosphate. Guidelines state that it should be gold AND iron.
